- Boys & Girls Club of Lake County one of 4000 chapters chartered member advantage of having time tested and proven programs to adapt. Lots of experience data to improve programs.
- As a chartered organization, they're completely independent of Nat'l have their own board/budget.
- Help kids age 6-18 become responsible caring citizens make sure all children are on a path to graduate HS with a plan for the future.
- Lake County Chapter (Located in Waukegan/North Chicago) has been around for 20 years, 10,000 people through their doors. Before Covid, they were actively serving about 250-300 kids in 4 locations in Waukegan/North Chicago. Have the only full sized gym in Waukegan. Served 1400 youth in 2019, including 200,000 hrs programming in the Three Pillars.
- Club programming has Three Pillars.
 - Academic Success
 - Healthy Lifestyles
 - Good Citizenship and Character.
- Remind kids that they may be in need, but people need them too, have them look outside themselves.
- Provide mentoring, tutoring, ie. person from Reading Power to help kids improve.
- In 2019 100% of club youth achieved on time grade progression, 100% of teens, no law enforcement, 94% no drugs/alcohol.
- During Covid they're distributing 2500 meals per week (and household supplies) to the less fortunate, live programming (online) and have been helping provide internet connectivity.
- Ready to open up in the Fall. Looking for unrestricted support and volunteers mentors who are comfortable with Zoom conversations.
